### Report On the Standalone Financial Statement

We have audited the accompanying standalone financial statements of M/S Intellect Buildcon Private Limitedwhich comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2017, the Statement of Profit and Loss and the Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

### Management's Responsibility for the Standalone Financial Statements

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion on the standalone financial statements.


### **Opinion**

### Note-1 A.Significant Accounting Policies:

### BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### INVESTMENTS

Current investments are carried at lower of cost and quoted/fair value, computed category-wise. Non Current investments are stated at cost. Provision for diminution in the value of Non Current investments is made only if such a decline is other than temporary

Tax expense comprises of current tax and deferred tax. Current tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid to the tax authorities, using the applicable tax rates The Company had booked defered tax on the difference of closing WDV under companies act and closing WDV under income tax act.
